REBUILDING TOGETHER AND LOWE'S TEAM UP TO RENOVATE AND REPAIR TWO AURORA HOMES FOR NATIONAL REBUILDING DAY

(Aurora, IL) – This week, volunteers from Lowe's Home Improvement and Rebuilding Together Aurora are dedicating their time and expertise to improve homes in the Aurora.

The Rebuilding Together Aurora repairs are among 50 projects funded by Lowe's Charitable and Educational Foundation through a \$250,000 grant.
